Pride Month

In honor of Pride month during June, please enjoy some historic resources.

- The Oregon Encyclopedia features LGBTQ history in Oregon.
- The Eugene Lesbian History Project is a community-based, digital humanities project that preserves and shares the unique history of the lesbian community in Eugene, Oregon. The project includes filmed oral histories with 83 narrators, a digital exhibit, and a documentary film.
- Just Out was a bimonthly newspaper that served as a news platform and editorial voice for the region's LGBTQIA+ community. The Oregon Digital Newspaper Project have made editions from 1983 to 2011 freely available and keyword-searchable online.
- Gay and Lesbian Archives of the Pacific Northwest (GLAPN) helps individuals and groups preserve their own historical data. They try to find a home for historically significant materials when they become available. GLAPN gladly partners with organizations in the community to publicize and celebrate the history of all LGBTQ-identified minorities in Oregon and the Pacific Northwest.

Read "The Queer-Inclusive Museum"



Museums are demonstrating an increased commitment to LGBTQ communities through exhibitions that center their stories. These queer-focused exhibitions are valuable tools for broadening representation, but the messages they carry are only as strong as the institution's commitment to queer inclusion. When queer narratives are limited to temporary exhibitions during Pride Month or isolated in queer-themed galleries, it suggests that they are "special interest" and unimportant. However, with the support of comprehensive queer inclusion, exhibitions can be stronger, more powerful tools for inclusion. This article explores queer inclusion in four tiers: programming, temporary exhibitions, interpretive strategy, and broad institutional commitment.
